

Before You Move Money: Simple Steps to Protect What Matters

Follow these five steps to protect yourself.

- 1 Talk to someone first. Before moving any money, speak to a trusted friend, family member, or advisor.
- ² **Take a step back.** Does the situation make sense when you look at the big picture? Or are there details that seem suspicious or too good to be true?
- 3 Acknowledge the red flags. If something feels off, don't ignore it. Talk through your concerns with someone you trust.
- 4 **Disconnect and pause.** Give yourself space from the situation or person. Scammers rely on urgency to cloud your judgment.
- (5) **Verify independently.** Can you confirm the legitimacy of the person, company, or offer using trusted, outside sources—not just what they've told you?

Know these common red flags of fraud.

- You're keeping it a secret—no one else knows what's happening.
- You're being dishonest with your financial institution.
- You're being asked to send more money in order to receive money.
- Communication is **only electronic**, and there are constant delays or broken promises.
- You're pressured to act immediately, often using fear to force quick decisions.
